BOUNDARY OF PROPOSED SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT IN SAN MATEO COUNTY

Beginning at the point of intersection of the line marking the boundary between the County of San Mateo and the City and County of San Francisco with the shore of the Pacific Ocean, and running thence southerly along the shore of the Pacific Ocean to the point where it is intersected by the southwesterly line of the 196.73-acre tract of McNee Co.; thence southeasterly to the most southerly corner of said McNee tract; thence northeasterly, easterly, northerly, easterly and northerly along the southerly and easterly lines of the various properties of said McNee Co., to the point of intersection thereof with the southerly line of the 40-acre parcel of Elizabeth Rooney and James Zimmerman in Section 24, Township 4 South, Range 6 West, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian; thence easterly along the southerly line of said Rooney and Zimmerman parcel and its easterly production to the westerly line of Section 19, Township 4 South, Range 5 West; thence northerly along said section line to the line dividing the north half from the south half of said Section 19; thence due east to the center of said Section 19; thence due north to the northerly line of said Section 19; thence due west to the northwest corner of said Section 19; thence north in a direct line to the southeasterly boundary of the San Pedro Rancho; thence northeasterly along said southeasterly Rancho line to the most easterly corner of the Jersey Farm Co., 1029.27 acre tract; thence northwesterly along the northeasterly boundary of said tract and the 133-acre tract of said Jersey Farm Company to the line dividing said last-named tract from the 152-43-acre tract of the City and County of San Francisco; thence northwesterly and northeasterly along said dividing line between the Jersey Farm Co., and the City and County of San Francisco to the southwesterly line of Skyline Boulevard; thence northwesterly along said line to the westerly production of the line dividing Mills Estate Inc., and Jersey Farm Co.; thence in a general northeasterly direction along said dividing line and its northeasterly production to the westerly line of State Highway known as El Camino Real; thence northwesterly along said westerly line of said Highway and the Old Mission Road to the southwesterly line of the right-of-way of the Market Street Railway; thence northwesterly along said right-of-way line to the northerly line of the 179.11-acre tract of Oliver D. Hamlin, Jr.; thence southwesterly along said northerly line of said Hamlin Tract to the westerly line of Junipero Serra Boulevard; thence in a general northerly direction along said westerly line of Junipero Serra Boulevard to the northerly line of San Mateo County; thence due west along said county boundary line to the point of beginning.
