4. CONSENT AGENDA:

- 4.1 Consideration/Adoption of the Draft Meeting Minutes for October 2007
- 4.2 Consideration/Adoption of Draft Financials for October 2007

ACTION: Roxy Stone MOVED to adopt the consent agenda. The motion was

SECONDED by Jim Reynolds, and CARRIED unanimously.

5. <u>ACTION ITEMS</u>:

- 5.1 Consideration/Adoption of Resolution 2007-3 authorizing a grant application to the California Coastal Commission for the Watershed Discovery Workshop, a watershed educational program.
 - Carolann Towe described the program and showed a PowerPoint presentation with photos. Kellyx Nelson gave further information about commitments that have been made by partners to the project and future plans if funded.

ACTION: Jim Reynolds MOVED adoption of Resolution 2007-3. The motion was SECONDED by Roxy Stone, and CARRIED unanimously.

- 5.2 Consideration/Adoption of Contract with Balance Hydrologics to perform hydrological studies that assist with the identification of sources of fecal pollution impacting Pillar Point Harbor.
 - Kellyx Nelson described the proposed role of Balance Hydrologics in the Pillar Point Harbor project and went through the contract terms with the Board.
 - Rich Allen asked if any chance of them going over their scope of work/budget. Kellyx said that if they do, it is their risk. The work plan in the contract is aligned with the budget.

ACTION: Jim Reynolds MOVED adoption of the contract with Balance Hydrologics. The motion was SECONDED by Roxy Stone, and CARRIED unanimously.

6. <u>DISCUSSION ITEMS</u>

- 6.1 Quarterly Financial Assessment Tabled for December meeting
- 6.2 San Bruno Mountain Eucalyptus Eradication Project
 - Rich Allen presented a PowerPoint prepared by Sam Herzberg of County Parks that described their eucalyptus management project on San Bruno Mountain.
 - RCD and NRCS staff discussed allellopathy, resprouting, ecological effects of eucalyptus, and treatment strategies.
 - Rich envisions a variation of this project for San Vicente Creek.
 - Kellyx and Jim Howard noted that six different producers have expressed interest in this type of project on their land
 - Kellyx suggested that when referring to eucalyptus we should refer to what we are restoring to, not what we are eradicating. The issue is restoration, not elimination.

ACTION:

- Kellyx will follow up with Rich Gordon's office to find out what the status is for a tree ordinance that was in the works.
- Kellyx will follow up with biologists of the Coastal Commission regarding the status of the obstacles they face in removing the eucalyptus.

7. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATES

- 7.1 Frenchman's Creek and Apanolio Canyon Fish Passage Projects
 - Construction is completed.
 - Kellyx is preparing final reports, which she will present to the Board at a later date.
 - The landowners and operators on the lands are pleased with the project outcomes.

7.2 Bear Gulch Upslope Erosion Control Project

- Steve Nichols' consultant (J.R.Rodine) had submitted concerns to the County regarding how the project was done. Kellyx welcomed a County inspection of the site. Dan Resnick (DFG), Him Howard (NRCS), John Green (PWA), Jim Eggemeyer and Mike Schaller (County Planning), Jim Reynolds (RCD Board), Kelly McCanless (contractor), and Lisa Cottrell (BGRA landowner) attended. Steve Nichols had a soil consultant present to represent his concerns.
- PWA, DFG, NRCS, and Lisa Cottrell said the project was well-done and a great success.
- Lisa Cottrell made it clear that Steve Nichols was representing his concern, not the landowners as a whole, and that other landowners were thrilled with the work.
- \$6,000 remains set aside for any needed winter touch up.

7.3 Pilarcitos Creek Integrated Watershed Management Plan

- October public workshop was very successful. Keith Mangold and PWA gave excellent presentations.
- Good turnout- about 50 people came for several hours in the middle of their Saturday.
- One recommendation was to invite members of HMB Planning Commission next time.
- Kellyx is discussing with SFPUC how to manage the months when she will be on maternity leave, when the draft plan gets comments, and final plan is issued.

7.4 Agricultural Water Quality Improvement

 There are ten or eleven projects relating to agricultural water quality protection in different phases, depending on their permitting needs and how complicated they are.

7.5 <u>Critical Coastal Areas Pilot Project</u>

ACTION:

• Carolann, Rich and Kellyx have been reviewing the draft assessment and need to to propose new language that was due on the 13th of November.

7.6 <u>Integrated Regional Water Management Planning</u>

• Kellyx explained what IRWMP is. Unlike the Pilarcitos and San Gregorio IWMPs that address a watershed, IRWMP addresses a region.

- RCD has taken the lead in coordinating coastside entities to look at a strategy on how to apply for funds coming out of Prop 84 for Regional Water Management.
- Kellyx has advised the group that if they want the RCD to continue this role, position coastside to apply for the funds, and prepare the grant, they are going to have to pay for her time.
- CCWD and Sewer Authority thought that would not be a problem.

7.7 Ecology Action's Livestock and Land Program

- Rich reported that this is a group out of Santa Cruz who have been running livestock and land program which is a series of demonstration projects and related workshops.
- Kellyx explained that the group is applying for a second round of funding and would like to include the San Mateo RCD to be a partner.
- They would like to expand their project, and would like us to be a subcontractor. They would receive funds, some of which would be passed to us, to develop what would be an appropriate program for our region.
- Kellyx told them that the San Mateo RCD would be interested in this project.

7.8 Blue Circle

- Next topic will be "Watershed Projects in San Mateo County" which will include watershed planning and established watershed groups, including the Critical Coastal Area project, Pilarcitos IWMP, San Gregorio IWMP and the San Fransquito Creek watershed group.
- Carolann mentioned that Pacifica's San Pedro Creek watershed group should be included as well.

ACTION

- Carolann will investigate hall in San Pedro for the meeting location.
- Randy Darnell's location on San Vicente Creek? Who will check into it?
- Cemetery at the top of Skyline? This would be free.
- Long Branch Saloon/Ranch? Perhaps for next Blue Circle in which coastside old timers will talk about historic land use
- The silent auction is still the Board's responsibility. The Board can help with a location as well if Carolann cannot get the hall
- Kellyx will continue to approach speakers.
- Tentative date to be in January 2008

7.9 Upcoming Dates/Events

Kellyx reported on the CARCD meeting. Her presentation on easements was to a sell-out crowd. She is very hesitant about RCDs taking on easements primarily because it makes them de facto a regulatory agency. The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors will be held on Thursday, 20 December, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Supporting Information for Resolution 2007-3

Resolution 2007-3 is required as part of a grant application to the Coastal Commission for a watershed education program. This memorandum provides information about the proposed program.

Title: Watershed Discovery Workshop

Vision: California will be a community of watershed stewards and informed scientists that experience clean local waters.

Audience: fifth grade classrooms, including underserved communities

Goals and Objectives:

Prepare a community of watershed stewards and scientists.

- Students will meet volunteer and professional stewards, including resource specialists, park rangers, and community watershed stewards.
- Students will acquire skills in the sciences by working with scientific tools and methodology in the field and in a laboratory.

Improve watershed literacy.

- Students will learn what a watershed is, what non-point source pollution is, and how their actions impact watersheds.
- Students will understand the land-sea connection.

Program Description:

The Watershed Discovery Workshop is a hands-on exploration of the San Vicente Watershed. Visits to Fitzgerald Marine Reserve and Moss Beach Ranch will include classroom instruction, field exploration and hands-on science lessons.

In the Reserve, at the mouth of San Vicente Creek, San Mateo County park rangers provide an introduction to the watershed, resident wildlife, and the impacts of water quality on the marine life found in the intertidal zone. Students collect water samples from the surf zone using professional equipment.

Upstream at Moss Beach Ranch, a privately owned horse boarding facility, students learn about the creek, riparian zone, and best management practices in ranching. Students participate in activities that demonstrate how watersheds develop over time, and how non-point source pollution affects water quality. In a water quality laboratory at Moss Beach Ranch, students prepare the samples they collected at Fitzgerald Marine Reserve for testing levels and presence of indicator bacteria, an activity that mirrors the testing conducted by San Mateo County Public Health Lab.

Project Status and Timeline:

- The curriculum has been developed and tested.
- Two classes have committed to participate and others are being contacted.
- The Water Quality Laboratory at Moss Beach Ranch has been constructed.
- San Mateo County Parks Department has committed to participate.
- The grant application is due December 7, 2007.
- Funding will be awarded by the end of March 2008.
- If funded, classes will begin spring 2008.
